

## **HEDIS**<sup>®</sup> MY 2024 Hybrid Measure Pocket Guide

This Pocket guide is designed to offer quick tips on each of the Hybrid measures to improve your HEDIS® scores, P4P payments, and reduce the number of charts that we may need to collect from you. Many of the tips are a reminder that you can get credit for services on most measures during Telehealth visits if properly documented and coded. Please use the HEDIS® Resources on the L.A. <b>BPD</b> Blood Pressure Control for Patients With Diabetes	<ul> <li>Blood pressure readings taken by the member on the day of the Telehealth visit are acceptable.</li> <li>If initial BP reading is 140/90 or higher, repeat BP. May take multiple BP readings on same day. When reporting these - take lowest systolic and lowest diastolic reading as the representative BP reading on this visit.</li> <li>Do not use ranges and thresholds in documenting BP readings.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>CBP</b> Controlling High Blood Pressure	<ul> <li>Blood pressure readings taken by the member on the day of the Telehealth visit are acceptable.</li> <li>If initial BP reading is 140/90 or higher, repeat BP. May take multiple BP readings on same day. When reporting these - take lowest systolic and lowest diastolic reading as the representative BP reading on this visit.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>CCS</b> Cervical Cancer Screening	<ul> <li>Document date of latest pap smear and/or HPV <i>and</i> result (member reported is acceptable).</li> <li>Document date and <i>type</i> of Hysterectomy <i>OR</i> note absence of cervix.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>EED</b> Eye Exam for Patients With Diabetes	<ul> <li>Refer members yearly for dilated eye exam if diagnosed with retinopathy or every other year if normal eye exam (i.e., no retinopathy).</li> <li>When documenting eye exam in progress notes, include date, result and provider name or specialty.</li> <li>Eye exam must only be done by optometrist or ophthalmologist.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>GSD</b> Glycemic Status Assessment for Patients with Diabetes	<ul> <li>Re-check glycemic HbA1c later in the year if it is high.</li> <li>Monitor and document glucose level data in the progress notes. Include GMI results collected by member in the medical record.</li> <li>Aim for glycemic HbA1c or glucose management indicator (GMI) of &lt;8.0%.</li> <li>When documenting glycemic HbA1c test or GMI value in progress notes, include date and result.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>

<b>CIS</b> Childhood Immunization Status	<ul> <li>Administer all required vaccines within the vaccines' recommended timeframe.</li> <li>All vaccines must be given on or before 2nd birthday. Refer to the CDC Immunization Guidelines for vaccines that may have been missed due to COVID 19.</li> <li>Flu mist (LAIV) must only be given on child's 2nd birthday.</li> <li>Rotavirus - Note type (Rotarix or Rotateq) or manufacturer. CDC recommends not to give vaccine beyond 8 months.</li> <li>MMR - only administer a combination vaccine.</li> <li>Participate in CAIR registry if not signed up.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>LSC</b> Lead Screening in Children	<ul> <li>Children must test for lead poisoning prior their 2nd birthday.</li> <li>Perform one or more capillary or venous lead blood test.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>COA</b> Care of Older Adults	<ul> <li>Perform Annual Wellness Exam during Telehealth visit.</li> <li>Medication Review, Assess Functional Status and Pain Assessment.</li> <li>There must be a Medication List in the medical record.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>IMA</b> Immunizations for Adolescents	<ul> <li>Administer all required vaccines within the vaccines' recommended timeframe.</li> <li>Allow 146 days between HPV 1 and HPV 2 (give on or between member's 9th and 13th birthdays).</li> <li>Participate in CAIR registry if not signed up.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>PPC</b> Prenatal and Postpartum Care	<ul> <li>Prenatal/Postpartum visits must only be provided by PCP, OBGYN or CNM.</li> <li>Visits must have name, signature and provider type.</li> <li>A diagnosis of Pregnancy is required if initial prenatal visit is performed by PCP.</li> <li>For post partum visit, document date of delivery.</li> <li>Evaluation of weight, BP, breast and abdomen must be documented in post partum visits.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
<b>TRC</b> Transitions of Care	<ul> <li>Include date received and provider signature when acknowledging receipt of admission notification and discharge summary from hospital/IPA.</li> <li>For follow up visit after discharge from hospital, documentation must reference to hospitalization, admission or inpatient stay.</li> <li>Include current medication list and discharge meds when reconciling medications.</li> <li>Medication reconciliation may be done by prescribing practitioner, clinical phamacist, physician assistant or registered nurse.</li> <li>Medication reconciliation <i>does not</i> require member to be present.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
WCC Weight Assessment and Counseling for Nutrition and Physical Activity for Children/Adolescents	<ul> <li>Member/Parent reported biometrics like HT and WT BMI% are allowed with telehealth visits and should be noted on the day of the visit. BMI percentile can be calculated or plotted on the member's BMI "age-growth" chart.</li> <li>Anticipatory Guidance for nutrition and physical activity are allowed in sick visits.</li> <li>Use appropriate CPT codes to capture data.</li> </ul>
