Community Outreach & Engagement (CO&E) Report

- The training for the newly elected Chairs and Vice Chairs took place on Wednesday, August 29, 2018 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The training was well attended and the new RCAC Vice Chair, Maria Angeles Refugio shared with the group her experience and stated she enjoyed the topics that were presented.
- The final ECAC Leadership Training is scheduled for Friday, September 28, 2018, which will be titled "L.A. Care Business Part 2". This training is mandatory for all Chair, Vice-Chair and At-Large Members.

RCAC Member Polo Shirts

- All RCAC 11 Members received their polo shirts that were ordered a few months ago. RCAC Members are able to wear their shirts for RCAC meetings, health fairs, and Community Outreach events scheduled throughout the year as part of the Work-plan projects.
- Additional shirts will be ordered for new members who join the RCAC.

Legislative Update

Proposition 10

- In November, California voters will decide whether to give cities and counties freedom to expand the use of rent control.
- This initiative would allow local governments to adopt rent control ordinances and regulations that govern how much landlords can charge tenants for renting apartments and houses. Proposition 10 would also state that a local government's rent control ordinance shall not abridge a fair rate of return for landlords.
- L.A. Care will keep tracking this proposition and will bring back the outcome following the November elections.
- Lluvia Salazar, RCAC Chair, provided an update on the following legislative topics presented at the September 12, ECAC meeting:

		 At the end of August, the California Legislature ended its 2018 legislative session. The Legislature considered a number of budget proposals as well as legislation to expand Medi-Cal eligibility and improve affordability of individual coverage through state-funded subsidies and cost sharing support. None of the budget proposals made it into the final 2018-19 state budget that was passed in June. The following bills did not make it out of Committee and are dead. Assembly Bill 2965 (Arambula) and Senate Bill 974 (Lara) aimed to use state only funds to expand the Medi-Cal program to include undocumented adults who would otherwise be eligible for Medi-Cal benefits but are not currently eligible because of their immigration status. Assembly Bill 2430 (Arambula) aimed to end the poverty trap for elderly Californians who are just on the wrong side of being 123 percent of the poverty line, and who currently don't qualify for Medi-Cal. RCAC Members will continue to receive updates about the two legislative bills at their upcoming RCAC meetings.

VI	WORK PLAN PROJECT Frank Meza, Field Specialist	 RCAC/ Community Work Plan Projects 2017/2018 Community Partnership Toyin Idehen, Executive Director, from United Against Poverty and Disease (UAPAD) provided an update from the Women's Health & Wellness event that took place on Saturday August 25, 2018 at the Park Tree Community Health Center in the city of Pomona. This event was beneficial and all attendees learned about the available services in the immediate service area. Additionally, the health center's prenatal program was in attendance and provided information about available services for pregnant women. The Comprehensive Perinatal Services Program (CPSP) connects pregnant women with various services that they may need throughout their pregnancy such as housing, food, mental health and other social services.

		The partnership with UAPAD was great for this event in that both organizations focus on women's health promotion and management, which was the key focus of the event. In addition, Park Tree provides behavioral health services in addition to health education to their patients and the community.
	Health Education Training Evaluation Frank Meza provided a presentation about the results from the pre and post-tests that were comp members during the Health Education presentations at the RCAC meetings on the three following topics: Diabetes Heart Health Cervical Cancer All participants were asked the following questions to gather feedback: How much our members know before and after each presentation How much our members learned, and If the presentation was successful or needed improvement The results of the pre and post-tests were broken down into percentages per heath topic, which ill whether there was an increase or decrease in their knowledge of the material after completing each presentation. Frank Meza encouraged members to provide feedback whether the training materials are too long level, which may make it difficult for members to retain the information and in return provide whe learned to their community.	
		 RCAC Work-Plan Community Outreach Events Members will be participating in 2-3 Outreach Events in their community to provide basic information on Diabetes, Heart Health, and Cervical Cancer. Frank Meza and Felicia Gray will call members when the logistics for the Outreach Events have been finalized, so members can plan to attend.
